It has been a very busy month for Deaf Sports Australia. We successfully held our 29th Annual General Meeting on 20 November, attended by 13 of our 16 Full Members. It was a straight-forward AGM, with Phil Harper and I re-elected for three-year terms. Paul Grogan of the Australian Sports Commission was a guest at our AGM. As per our Constitution, the Board of Directors elect their President and Vice President annually at the first Board Meeting following the AGM, which will take place on 8 December.

Congratulations to DeafACT and Deaf Volleyball Australia - they were endorsed as DSA's 17th and 18th Full Members at our AGM. DeafACT brings the total of State/Territory Members to five (along with Victoria, Queensland, South Australia and Western Australia) and Deaf Volleyball Australia is the 13th National Deaf Sporting Organisation to be affiliated to DSA. Their contact details can be found on our website - DSA looks forward to working with them!

Richard Pearce delivered an information session about the 2012 Australian Deaf Games that was well-received by our Members. Draft registration fees, sport venues and key details were shared with Members for consultation ahead of the official One Year to Go launch in January 2011.

In the evening, we successfully launched the inaugural Deaflympians Club in front of over 100 former Deaflympians, friends and family at Rydges on Swanston. Led by Cindy-Lu Bailey OAM and starring Andrew Swan MBE, two of our greatest-ever Deaflympians, each attending Deaflympian received a commemorative pin and there was a display of past memorabilia dating back to the 1965 World Games for the Deaf, which was the first Games that Australia participated in.

We also held our annual Sports Awards that evening. Congratulations go to the following winners of the 2010 Deaf Sports Awards who are outlined on page 4.

We received several nominations for each category, which were then whittled down to three finalists presented on the night. The above winners were very worthy winners - with Reece and Melinda receiving recognition for their outstanding efforts at the Taipei 2009 Deaflympic Games.

Check out the photos of the events from 20 November elsewhere in this eNews! Many thanks to Irena Farinacci for putting on the entire program of events, ably supported by Craig Dodson and the Board. Also, thanks to Auslan Services for sponsoring the events - very much appreciated!

On Friday 26 November the Minister for Sport, Sen. Mark Arbib, made an announcement regarding participation funding packages for Australian sport, one of the outcomes of the Crawford Report. Disappointingly, Deaf Sports Australia (and no other disability sport organisation for that matter) received new funding. The announcement can be found here:

DSA submitted a comprehensive proposal for participation funding, aligning with the *Active Deaf Australians* Proposal that we submitted to Minister Ellis in April, and again to Minister Arbib last month. To receive zero dollars is extremely disappointing and DSA is now taking immediate action on this with the Minister's Office and ASC. With the recent DSA Annual General Meeting and Sports Awards being held last week it is an opportune time to stop and reflect on the last 12 months at DSA. My immediate thought is that it has been a year of innovation and development for the organisation. I am proud of the fact that we have implemented a number of new programs, improved our existing communication material and developed a blueprint for the future of DSA.

A great step forward for DSA was developing and implementing our schools education workshop series which saw us visit 11 schools and over 300 deaf and hard of hearing children. The workshops enabled DSA to connect with the next generation of the deaf sporting community and promote the health and social benefits of sports, sporting opportunities available and profiling deaf role models.

Earlier this year we broke new ground by holding our Women in Sport Workshop (supported by the Australian Sports Commission) to help identify and support more female leaders in deaf sport. Each DSA Member organisation sent representatives to attend the workshop and DSA has identified a further 5 -10 potential young females to attend. The workshop saw much important discussion and it is hoped that many of those who attended the workshop will become future leaders.

Over the last year DSA has made a number of changes to our monthly newsletter (e-news) to make it a more relevant and enjoyable newsletter to read. Some of the main changes include a monthly focus on a DSA member sport, interviews with athletes (past and present), more photos and an easier to read layout. In addition to E-news DSA undertook a major review and overhaul of our Facebook page. Facebook is becoming increasingly important as a communication mechanism and also can provide opportunities to connect with new people who may not access more traditional communication mechanisms. DSA's current Facebook page has over 500 members from all over the globe, which illustrates how important it is to us. Keeping up with the times DSA also entered the world of twitter.

We have also improved our website which now has an integrated National Participation

Database. This is crucial for DSA as it finally allows us to gather data and statistics on participation rates and levels amongst deaf and hard of hearing Australians. Importantly, it provides us with the necessary evidence when approaching Government for further targeted support.

Much work has also been done on looking at DSA's future in Australian sport and we prepared a comprehensive response to the Federal Government Commissioned Crawford Report into Australian Sport, submitted a participation funding proposal to the ASC and developed the Active Deaf Australians Program - a new 3 year program developed to help tackle the health crisis facing deaf Australians, which we presented to the former Minister for Sport, the Hon Kate Ellis. We are now discussing the proposal with the Sport Minister Senator Mark Arbib and we are hopeful of receiving a positive response in the new year.

I am proud of the new innovations we have implemented over the last year and look forward to trying new things in 2012 to help keep DSA relevant in what is a forever changing sporting landscape in Australia.

Until next month I hope you enjoy reading this month's edition.

DSA Deaflympians' Club Launched!

Deaf Sports Australia recently launched the Deaflympians' Club for the first time, which was held in conjunction with their annual Sports Awards. This special occasion was hosted by our six time Deaflympian Champion, Cindy-Lu Bailey (nee Fitzpatrick) OAM.

The event was attended by over 100 guests, including former Deaflympian Andrew Swan MBE who won several gold medals at Winter Deaflympic Games, Joanne Lambert a former World Record holder in Athletics, Reece Van Beek 2 time medal winner at the Taipei Deaflympic Games and Life Member, Lauren Johns and Anne Bremner.

The event was to recognise and honour all Deaflympians on their contribution to deaf sports over the many years, since the first Australian competed at the Deaflympic Games in Washington DC in 1965. A selected array of memorabilia was displayed on the night which brought back memories for many of our Deaflympians. They were also presented with a Commemorative Pin by Jill Lovett, the late partner of John M. Lovett, former ICSD President.

Also marking the Deaflympians Club launch was the annual DSA Sports Awards. Both Cindy-Lu Bailey and Andrew Swan presented the trophies to the winners as outlined:

Female Athlete of the Year: Melinda Vernon, Athletics

Male Athlete of the Year: Reece Van Beek, Cycling

Volunteer of the Year: Tony Clews, Deaf Cricket Australia

Organisation of the Year: Cricket Australia

Media of the Year: Network Ten

DSA Female Athlete of the Year - Melinda Vernon

Melinda Vernon was the star performer for the Australian Team at the 2009 Taipei Deaflympic Games and this combined with a number of other outstanding performance in Open competitions throughout the year helped her claim the DSA Female Athlete of the year award.

Melinda won Australia's first Gold medal of the 2009 Taipei Deaflympic Games producing a breathtaking performance to win the women's 10,000 metres. Melinda set a cracking pace early in the race and jumped out to an early lead after the first lap with the rest of the field struggling to match her intensity. The conditions were energy sapping and Melinda had to dig deep with her superior fitness and condition showing in the end as she finished 18 seconds ahead of the second place getter from Russia.

In another emphatic victory breaking Melinda won her second gold in the 5,000 metre, also breaking the world record, held by Deaflympic legend and current Australian Athletics team manager Joanne Lambert by almost 45 seconds to claim the Gold in a time of 16:23. In a similar fashion to her 10,000 metres victory Vernon went out hard and opened up a commanding early lead in the hot and humid conditions and was never headed finishing almost one minute ahead of the silver medallist Russian Olga Yakubovskaya.

The victory was a gutsy win by Vernon who has struggled with illness following her energy sapping performance in the extreme heat and humidity in the 10,000 metres, which caused her to pull out of the 1,500 metres.

In addition to her Taipei heroics Melinda has continued to perform strongly in Open National Competitions although in the later half of 2010 she has struggled to overcome some injuries which hampered her attempts to qualify for the 2010 Delhi Commonwealth Games. Melinda's focus is now on overcoming her injury concerns and attempting to qualify for the 2012 London Olympic Games.



DSA Male Athlete of the Year - Reece Van Beek

Cyclist Reece-Emerson Van Beek had a stellar year which was highlighted by claiming silver and bronze medals at the 2009 Taipei Deaflympic Games and he was a worthy winner of the 2010 DSA Male Athlete of the year award.

In his first event at Taipei Reece was defending the individual time trial gold medal that he won at the 2005 Melbourne Deaflympics and in a fantastic performance he won the Bronze medal in a time of 48.05 minutes, missing the silver medal by an agonizingly tight margin of .0001 of a second.

In the Individual Road race at Taipei Reece placed 15th in what was arguably the best and closest road race seen in the history of the Deaflympics with at least 26 riders being in contention until the last few kilometers.

In the last race of his Taipei campaign Reece produced one of the finest efforts of his career to claim the silver medal in the 50km Points race. In stifling heat of around 40 degrees Reece mounted a brave solo attack late in the race to claim the silver medal.

In addition to his fine performances in Taipei Reece recently competed in the Tour de Formosa tournament for the deaf in Taiwan. Reece had to fight a lot against the larger teams during the Tour De Formosa in Taiwan with the strongest nations (Russia and USA) had a four rider team each, our Aussie team had to defend themselves with just two cyclist. Nevertheless Reece finished overall of 9th on the tour in what was another top performance on the world stage.

Reece has also continued to race in National Open Competition and in 2011 his attention will turn to the 2011 World Deaf Cycling Championships in Canada.

Dear ICSD Members,

ICSD wishes to inform its member countries that CEO Tiffany Granfors will make a 3rd, and final, site inspection in Slovakia--focusing on their preparedness to host the upcoming Winter Deaflympics in February 2011.



This trip--scheduled for next week--is beyond the usual one site inspection typically necessary to confirm a country's readiness to host a Deaflympics.

This visit is necessary in order to ensure that logistics are in place for the Games--including hotel, ice hockey and curling venues, and transportation, among others.

The host committee has also been having difficulty, to date, in securing necessary funding to pull off a successful Winter Deaflympics.

A final decision will be made by November 30th regarding the status of the 2011 Winter Deaflympics in Slovakia. ICSD always strives to ensure the best Games experience for its participants and fans and will therefore continue to work hard with the Slovakian hosts to see that nothing less than the best is offered.

Melinda Vernon Promotes Disability Rights

Springwood athlete and Blue Mountains Ambassador for International Day of People with Disability Melinda Vernon has overcome numerous personal and physical challenges to become a world-class runner.

Despite being born profoundly deaf in both ears, Melinda was up and running at a young age. She persisted with running throughout her late teens and early 20s, despite a jaw defect which obstructed her breathing. Her list of sporting achievements is extensive and remarkable from winning two gold medals in the 2009 Taipei Deaflympics to winning the women's division of the City2Surf in 2009.



Melinda is competitive at a world level against athletes both with and without a disability.

The distance runner will complete her Bachelor of Occupational Therapy at the University of Western Sydney this year. Upon graduating she has an interest in working in community settings in paediatrics, intellectual disabilities and occupational rehabilitation.

Melinda's sporting achievements should not overshadow her ceaseless promotion of the disability rights in the community. Melinda strongly believes "together we can do more to raise awareness of the issues people with disability face in our local region".

As part of the celebration of International Day for People with Disability (IDPWD) on December 3 a range of community events have been organised.

Blue Mountains City Council in partnership with the IDPWD committee has produced a brochure of events. These calendars can be picked up from council offices, local libraries and neighbourhood centres.

Tour de Formosa Deaf Cycling Championships

Recently, Reece Van Beek and Justin Dunn competed at the Tour de Formosa Cycling Championships that was held in Taipei, Taiwan, home of the 2009 Deaflympic Games. The Tour De Formosa (TDF) is a biennial invitation stage race for the deaf that included 7 mountainous stages up to 170kms. The TDF took place from October 29 to November 7. The Chinese Taipei Sports Association of the Deaf organizes the Tour de Formosa based on the idea of a one week European stage races and the liking of the Tour De France. Participation to the race is based on invitation to national teams composed of up to a maximum of four deaf and hard of hearing cyclists.
