2017 Deaflympic Games update

The 2-day visit to Samsun by Australia's Chef de Mission, Bryn Davies proved to be a very worthwhile exercise in gleaning important and necessary information to plan for the Deaflympics in July. Over the 2 days, several sport venues such as athletics, basketball, badminton, volleyball, swimming and football were inspected as well as the official accommodation venue of the Deaflympics, Ondokuyuz Mayis 19 University which is located 20 mins west of Samsun by car. These visits gave Bryn a very good understanding of the lay of the land and how the transportation system will work during the Deaflympics.



The trip also presented an opportunity to meet members of the Local Organising Committee (LOC) who are responsible for a variety of areas in organising the Deaflympics - security, transport, accommodation, sport venues, volunteers and so forth. Meeting them, as well as attending a presentation by the Chair of the LOC provided a smorgasboard of information that will be passed on to the Australian Deaflympics Team and the public in due course.

At the conclusion of the trip, Bryn left Samsun feeling very impressed with how the Samsun municipality and Turkish Government have embraced the responsibility of organising the Deaflympics and the way it has been set up in the current climate - security, transport, accommodation and sport venues - are of a high standard which augurs well for our athletes, officials and spectators who look forward to the July trip with renewed motivation!
