One of the first promotions for the Games was a 1 Year to Go Launch that was held recently in Albury at the famed Lauren Jackson Sports Centre. It was a successful event and an update on this is provided in this edition.

Not only is DSA busy preparing for the 2018 Australian Deaf Games, our athletes have also devoting their time in training, competing and fundraising on top of their routines to prepare for the 2017 Deaflympic Games to be held in Samsun, Turkey this year. Our Chef de Mission, Bryn Davies will attend an upcoming Chef de Mission meeting in Samsun to obtain updates on venues, security, accommodation and other Games related information. In addition, DSA has been lobbying with the Federal and State Governments to obtain funding to support the Australian Deaflympic Team. We are hopeful that these efforts will be rewarded.

The DSA Board will meet at the end of February to focus on planning for the next 12 months and beyond. This will include discussing the changes to the Active Deaf brand, fundraising and ongoing membership structure support. While DSA's funding remains critical, the Board and staff continue to work hard to find ways to ensure that our programs and events remain sustainable in the many years to come.

2017 Deaflympic Games update

The Australian Deaflympics Team (ADT) is taking shape as we edge closer to the 2017 Deaflympics, with selections being made for basketball, swimming, badminton and tenpin bowling. Athletics, cycling and tennis are the other sports that are finalising selection to the ADT at this stage, and we will have the ADT confirmed by early April. There will also be support staff positions advertised in March, so keep an eye out if you are interested to be involved as team interpreter or team medico.



I will be going to Samsun between 18th-21st February for the 2nd CdM seminar. This seminar will consist of a day and half of visiting sports venues, the Athletes Village and important places, and

one afternoon to meet with members of the organising committee and ICSD, and gain more information on how the Deaflympics will operate. An update from this visit will be in the next eNews.

We continue to monitor the security levels for Turkey in liaison with Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade, and at this stage we do not have any hesitation in travelling to Samsun for the Deaflympics.
